As a community centre in Sheffield, a learning disability organisation supporting over 250 clients each week, an employer of over 130 people, and a member of Sheffield Voluntary and Community sector, we fully accept the findings and recommendations of Sheffield's Race Equality Commission report. We take our responsibilities very seriously and have been taking steps over recent months to make progress in many areas of equity and inclusion, including on race equality. Improvements are being made, as lots of discussions are had in the process of working through our own plan which we started to work on early 2021 - "Our commitments to Diversity, Equity and Inclusion".
