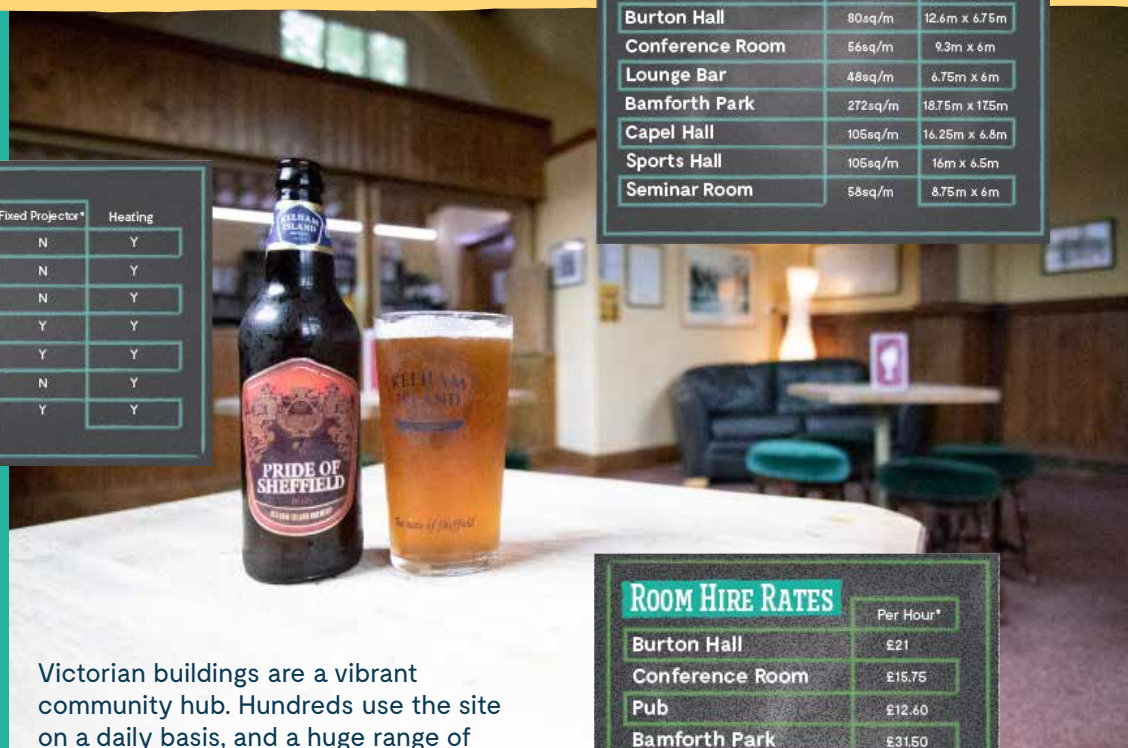

Burton Street

started its life in 1879, as Langsett Road School.

It remained open as a school for almost a century, ringing its bell for the last time in 1976. After being put to various small scale uses, it finally fell into disrepair in 1992. By 1995 the site was scheduled for demolition.

This is where things got interesting...

The local community didn't want to see the old school demolished. They

occupied the buildings and formed a new organisation called the Burton Street Foundation.

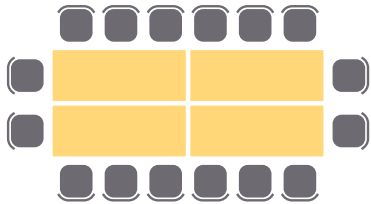
They quickly began making great use of the site by running various clubs, events and community services. This proved there was a need for it to remain, and eventually the Burton Street Foundation took ownership of the site.

Two decades later the beautiful

Victorian buildings are a vibrant community hub. Hundreds use the site on a daily basis, and a huge range of activities take place.

It's a pretty big organisation now, but Burton Street has never lost its soul. That's what makes it the special place it is.

Flexible room layouts

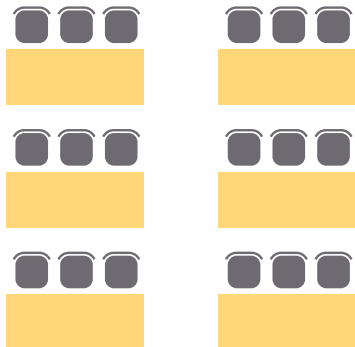
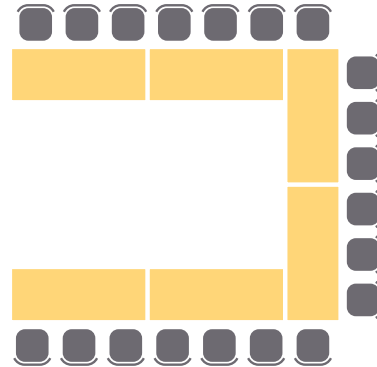


Boardroom

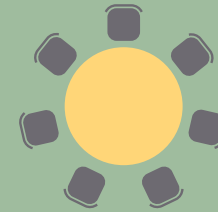
Perfect for large group discussions or formal meetings. If you need to discuss a community action plan, or thrash out a business deal, this is for you.

The perfect arrangement for dynamic training sessions, particularly where group work, participation and interaction is encouraged.

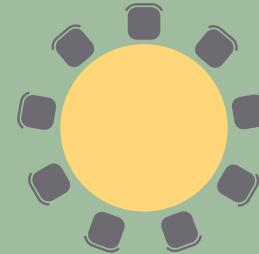


A formal teaching layout most suitable for occasions when there's more written work and less interaction.



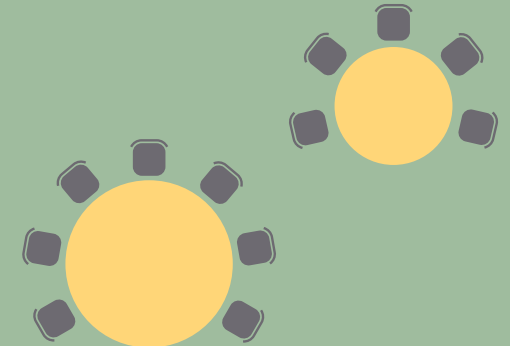
Banquet sevens + nines

Perfect for dining events that include a presentation or performance. Large tables allow for a social atmosphere, and everybody gets a good view.



Theatre

If a performance, screening or presentation is the main focus of your event, a theatre layout accommodates the highest number of people while offering the best view.

BU1 Burton Hall



Burton Hall is the main function space here at Burton Street. It's a popular venue for wedding receptions, birthday parties, dining events and dances.

Our Lounge Bar, Kitchens and Conference Room are conveniently situated right alongside, and the room has a PA system. Your phone will plug straight in.

It has large windows, tall ceilings with exposed timbers, and original parquet flooring. It is a charming, characterful and unique backdrop to any special event.

BL6 Café Meeting Room

The seminar room is a businesslike space where the focus is on work, on learning, and on collaboration.

There is a projector with sound, and wall mounted HDMI, VGA and network sockets make technical hook up a simple matter of plug and play.

It is based in the back of the café, so you aren't far away from a delicious hot meal and plenty of refreshments.



LL4 Sports Hall

Maybe you want a weekly kick around with your work colleagues. Maybe you run an aerobics class. Maybe your karate club needs a bit of room to grow. The sports hall may be for you.

But it's not all sport. Drama groups rehearse in the hall, and peer support groups use it as a friendly and informal meeting space.

So even if you're not interested in working up a sweat, it could still be the space for whatever activity you might have in mind!



CU3 Capel Hall

Capel Hall is the bit of Burton Street that still looks most like the old primary school. It's best thought of as a big activity space, rather than a function suite.

Equipped with a projector, lighting rig and a PA system, you can turn your meeting in to a full on disco at the drop of a hat.



BU2 Lounge Bar

Our cosy pub can comfortably accommodate 30 people, depending on layout. It can be booked on its own, or as a companion to our larger spaces.

The bar is always fully stocked with a great selection of beers, wines and spirits, ciders and soft drinks.

And if you have a favourite, let us know. We're not tied to any particular supplier, so we're always happy to get a barrel of your favourite beer on tap for your special occasion.



BU10 Conference Room

Originally a large classroom, now a popular venue for business and community meetings.

The room can be used as a standalone venue, or for larger functions when twinned with Burton Hall.

Amenities include access to the Lounge Bar, TV, interactive whiteboard, lift access, accessible WC, chairs and tables.



BA1 Bamforth Park

A popular venue for conferences, kids parties, theatre productions, art exhibitions, dance classes, live music, awards ceremonies, and gala dinners.

The space features an accessible stage, full lighting rig, PA system, projector, and screen. There is also a small cafe and various breakout rooms on all sides.
